Road Department Supervisor Corey Lehman

Hello residents of Perry Township. This winter was a very light winter for snow, approximately 100 tons of salt mixture was used. There were 44 hours of overtime worked this winter. We logged approximately 800 miles plowing. I would like to also ask that you check your mailbox post to make sure they are in good condition and not rotten. The force of the snow coming off the plows will break rotten posts and we are not responsible to replace rotten poles or broken plastic boxes. Just a reminder for next season.

Our road program this year is a coming in at \$209,798.22. There will be 2.69 miles of roadway will be sealed. Last year's sealing work was not completed in time and will be done this year, which was 3.07 miles for a total of 5.76 miles. We will be paving 1.48 miles. The price of paving and sealing are up in cost around 10 percent compared to last year, so our money doesn't go as far unfortunately. A mile of roadway that is 20 feet wide costs approximately \$90,000 to pave. Because of these increases, we are not able to improve the roads as much as we would like to. Our Dura-patching of roads is also included in the program. In 2022, 11 miles of roadway were patched in 2022 with plans to patch more miles this year. We are working with Auglaize Township to do some crack patching in both of our townships. We have a great working relationship in that we can share work that requires additional manpower. More work can be accomplished if both townships work together.

If you see a basin that will not drain off once water has receded or is standing when it has been dry, please contact us at the road department so the issue can be looked into and taken care of. If you see any large holes in the right of way, please contact us so the broken tile can be fixed so it doesn't create potentially larger problems. Some crossover and basin work will be taking place this year on roads that are on schedule to be paved in 2024.

Mowing of the ditches this summer will be done as usual with mowing starting in early May. Cutting of ditch banks will also be done with the arm mower, as needed. Cemetery mowing is also a big part of our maintenance work in the spring and summer. A list of cemetery rules and regulations are available on our website or can be picked up at road department office. Also, if any drive permits or tile tap permits are needed please contact our office. We will also continue on our spraying of underbrush along woods to prevent overgrowth.

If you have any questions about the roads or ditches contact Corey Lehman (Road Supervisor) or Nick Adams at 419-221-3949. Someone is usually in the shop or office from 7:00-8:00 AM, 11:30-12:00, and 3:00-3:30 PM. If we are not there, please leave a message with name and number so we can return your call. We are still seeing a high number of junk cars in the township. The Ohio Revised Code (ORC) section 505.173 defines a junk car as one that is:

- 1. At least 3 model years old
- 2. Apparently inoperable
- 3. Extensively damaged such as missing wheels, tires, engine or transmission.

When you see me out driving around the township checking properties, feel free to stop me with any questions you may have. If I don't have an answer for you, I will get you one.

We are all hoping to see positive changes but know that it will take time. There are procedures we have to follow so be patient. We will do everything we can to have and safe and beautiful community. Thank you!

Our younger residents will also be out enjoying the sunshine, which means they will be out playing and riding their bikes. Please be mindful that children at play often forget to watch for traffic. Slow down when driving through neighborhoods and watch for children who might dart out into the roadway. Also, watch for bicyclists on both our neighborhood and country roadways.

As many of you may already know, on January 3, 2023, Governor Mike DeWine signed Senate Bill 288 that states it will be illegal to use or hold a cell phone or electronic device while driving in Ohio. This new law went into effect on April 4,

2023. This bill was put into place to strengthen the already in place ORC 4511.204, Driving While Texting Law. You are still able to make and receive calls while using the Bluetooth capabilities on both your phone and vehicle. However, this law does state that under most circumstances, if you are driving while also holding your phone an officer has the right to pull you over and issue a citation.

I would like to take this time to congratulate Terry and Kim White. Both Terry and Kim retired from our department in January. While they were only with our department for a few short years, they have been serving and protecting the residents of Allen County for a combined total of over 70 years. Their knowledge and dedication will be missed and I wish them nothing but the best in their retirement.

In closing, I would like to remind our residents that we are a part-time police department. If you have an emergency call 9-1-1; or, if an officer is needed, please call the Sheriff's Department. If a Perry Township officer is on duty, they will be dispatched to your location. For all other questions or concerns call 419-221-1870 and leave a message.
