MINUTES OF PERRY TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

MEETING
HELD MAY 20, 2025

PERRY TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES MET IN REGULAR SESSION, CALLED TO ORDER AT 6:30 BY CHAIRPERSON KEVIN COX, PRESENT. LARRY SIDENER PRESENT, GREG KESSEN, PRESENT, ROLLCALL BY FISCAL OFFICER. THE TRUSTEES PRAYER AND THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE FOLLOWED.

CHRISTINA STOMBAUGH, FISCAL OFFICER –

CHRISTINA ASKED THE BOARD TO SET A DATE FOR CLEAN-UP DAY WHICH WILL BE SATURDAY, JULY 19TH FROM 9AM UNTIL 1 PM. GREG ASKED KEVIN TO ORDER THE DUMPSTERS FROM ALLEN COUNTY RECYCLING.

CHRISTINA ASKED TO SET THE FIRST BUDGET MEETING. SHE SPOKE WITH MOST OF THE BOARD AND DEPARTMENT HEADS ABOUT SETTING IT BEFORE THE NEXT REGULAR TRUSTEE MEETING ON JUNE 3RD AT 5PM. SHE ASKED THE DEPARTMENT HEADS TO PLEASE LET HER KNOW SOON ABOUT ANY BUDGET ITEMS THEY MAY NEED SO THAT SHE CAN GET THE INFORMATION TO EVERYONE BEFORE THE NEXT MEETING.

SHE THEN ASKED ANYONE THAT HASN'T COMPLETED THEIR NEWSLETTER YET TO PLEASE DO SO SOON AND GET IT TO HER.

CHRIS THEN SPOKE ABOUT CHANGING THE CREDIT CARD POLICY FOR ASHLYN TRACY, THE FIRE ADMIN ASSISTANT TO \$3000 INSTEAD OF \$2000. CHIEF RADER SPOKE ABOUT WHY IT IS NECESSARY. THEY HAVE SOME MONTHLY BILLS SUCH AS OXYGEN THAT THEY NORMALLY PUT ON THE CREDIT CARD TO KEEP FROM HAVING LATE PAYMENTS. WHILE CHIEF RADER IS ON VACATION OR OFF FOR ANOTHER REASON THE ADMIN ASSISTANT COULD USE HER CARD TO PAY FOR IT BUT ALSO USES HERS FOR SUPPLIES SO THE \$2,000 IS GETTING USED TO OFTEN.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

JOHN ITEN, POLICE CHIEF – ABSENT

TRUSTEE SIDENER READ THE UPDATE FROM CHIEF ITEN. LETTER ATTACHED

“A resident asked Mr. Sidener about a shooting or gun shots somewhere in the vicinity of 13th St., but unknown exactly where it happened. (This was also the night of a shooting in the 700 Blk of S. Main St., in Lima). From the Sheriff’s Office Call Records, there was an incident called into the sheriff’s office dispatch, the male left the residence, and while driving away from the unknown address, fired a shot off. Nothing indicated that anything was hit. Notes stated that the male was not located. No other information was available.

Lt. Watson has noticed an increase in traffic using Main St., with the McClain and Hanthorn intersection shut down. With the increased traffic, officers are enforcing traffic violations of stop signs and speeding. Officers have spent more time on traffic enforcement in this area.

Chief and Admin Assist. Will be attending a free grant writing class on June 9th to aid in obtaining grants for the department. Neither of us have much experience in grant writing, so a free course is a good start.

The police department did receive a donation from the United States Deputy Sheriff’s Association Program that provides equipment to small and or underfunded departments. The department was awarded a FLIR – Thermal Camera. It values \$700.00, and a thank you was sent on behalf of the department.”

COREY LEHMAN, ROAD SUPERVISOR –

NICK HANDED IN A LIST OF ROADS FOR ACCESS MANAGEMENT ROADS. THE BOARD WAY WANT TO ADD AMHERST ROAD BACK TO IT. LARRY STATED THAT THEY PREVIOUSLY REMOVED AMHERST ROAD FROM MCCLAIN TO GREELY CHAPEL. BRION RHODES FROM ALLEN COUNTY ENGINEERS SUGGEST THE BOARD MAKE ACTION FIRST FOR THE LIST THAT WILL BE MANAGED BY ACCESS MANAGEMENT. CHAIRPERSON COX EXPLAINED THAT IF SOMEONE BOUGHT PROPERTY IN THAT AREA THAT THEY WOULD NEED TO DO A ROAD STUDY BEFORE PLACING A DRIVEWAY. THE BOARD WILL TABLE IT FOR NOW.

COREY ASKED THAT WHY LOOKING AT THE HANDBOOK TO ALSO LOOK AT HRA FAMILY PLAN “TASC” FOR A POSSIBLE INCREASE.

ON MAY 8TH THE ROAD DEPARTMENT STARTED MOWING DITCHES.

DURAPATCHING MACHINES ARE FILLED AND THEY WILL BE STARTING THAT POSSIBLY NEXT WEEK.

THEY HAVE TILES THAT NEED REPAIRED.

THEY INSTALLED NEW BASINS ON BREESE ROAD OFF OF YODER AND ON KERR RD.

THE PARTS FOR THE FIRE HYDRANT THAT WAS HIT ON BREESE RD HAS BEEN ORDERED. IT TAKES 12 WEEKS TO GET THE PARTS SO THEY ORDERED PARTS FOR TWO MORE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,627.74.

COREY WILL BE ON VACATION FROM JUNE 8TH – 14TH. NICK WILL BE ON VACATION THE FOLLOWING WEEK.

JOHN BREWSTER, ZONING INSPECTOR –

CHAIRMAN COX STATED THAT BLAIN BROCK COULDN'T BE HERE TONIGHT.

JOHN BREWSTER TURNED IN ZONING RECEIPTS FOR MARCH AND APRIL.

JOHN TURNED IN AN APPLICATION FROM CODY LAPOINT FOR ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS. GREG STATED THAT HE SPOKE TO CODY ABOUT THE LENGTH OF TIME HIM AND HIS FAMILY LIVED IN PERRY TOWNSHIP. HE ALSO SPOKE ABOUT HIS CAREER BACKGROUND WHICH WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR THE BOARD. JOHN STATED THAT WE STILL NEED MORE PEOPLE.

JOHN STATED THAT THERE HAS BEEN INCREASED TRAFFIC AND TRAFFIC STOPS BECAUSE OF THE CLOSURES OF MCCLAIN AT HANTHORN. SEMI'S HAVE ALSO BEEN DRIVING NEIGHBORHOOD STREETS THAT HAVE BEEN GETTING INCREASED WEAR AND TEAR.

JOHN SPOKE WITH THE CITY OF LIMA. THEY REQUIRE PERMITS FOR ALL SHEDS BUT ONLY TAX SHEDS THAT ARE LARGER THAN 144 SQUARE FOOT. RESIDENT FRANK CLEMENTZ ASKED WHY WE ARE PERMITTING SHEDS LESS THAN 12 X 12. HE ALSO ASKED IF ANYONE CHECKED WITH THE OTHER TOWNSHIPS. FRANK THEN ASKED WHY HE HASN'T RECEIVED THE ZONING MINUTES YET. CHAIRMAN COX ASKED CHRISTINA TO CHECK IF THE ZONING MINUTES HAVE BEEN APPROVED.

TRUSTEES DISCUSSION ABOUT THE 1ST RESOLUTION WAS IF WE CAN DO ANYTHING ABOUT THE ONES THAT ARE ALREADY AT RESIDENCES PRESENTLY BUT JOHN BREWSTER EXPLAINED THAT WE CAN TELL THEM ABOUT THE CHANGE.

JOHN BREWSTER SPOKE ABOUT RESIDENTS THAT WOULD LIKE TO OPEN A DOG GROOMING BUSINESS AT THEIR RESIDENCE ON CRABB ROAD. JOHN STATED THAT THERE ISN'T ANYTHING IN CONDITIONAL USES THAT WOULD PERMIT IT. TRUSTEE COX STATED THAT THERE ARE A LOT OF BUSINESSES THAT ARE PERMITTED. TRUSTEE KESSEN STATED THAT IS WHY WE HAVE ZONING REGULATIONS TO HAVE THE CORRECT TYPE OF GROWTH IN THE AREA. GREG SUGGESTED TO REACH OUT TO REGIONAL PLANNING. THE RESIDENTS SPOKE ABOUT ALREADY BUYING A SHED TO USE FOR THE BUSINESS AND STATED THAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO OPEN IT SOON IF PERMITTED. THE TRUSTEES AGREED TO HAVE JOHN BREWSTER TALK TO REGIONAL PLANNING BEFORE MAKING A DECISION.

THE BOARD SPOKE ABOUT THE COURT CASE FOR THE LIQUOR LICENSE FOR VICTORY LOUNGE THAT WILL TAKE PLACE ON JUNE 10TH IN COLUMBUS. JOHN BREWSTER AND KEVIN COX PLAN TO ATTEND AND THEY WILL SPEAK TO BLAIN BROCK FOR LEGAL ARGUMENTS. BLAIN ALSO SENT A LETTER TO VICTORY LOUNGE BUT NO RESPONSE YET. A MEMBER OF ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS IS WILLING TO WRITE A LETTER ALSO.

TRUSTEE COX STATED THAT BLAIN IS STILL WORKING ON THE TAX LEVY PAPERWORK.

KEVIN RADER, FIRE CHIEF –

CHIEF RADER SPOKE ABOUT CANDIDATES THAT HE WOULD LIKE TO HIRE. MICHAEL SEINER IS AN INSTRUCTOR AT APOLLO. LACEY PRICE IS GRADUATING FROM APOLLO THIS YEAR. THEY ALSO WANT HER TO TEST AS AN EMT. COSIMO DI TOLLA DOESN'T HAVE AN EMT CARD YET SO CHIEF RADER WOULD LIKE TO APPOINT HIM AS A VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTER NOW. HE ALSO REQUESTED TO HIRE ANDREW INAMDAR AS AN EMT BASIC. HE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO HIRE DIEGO WILLIAMS. HE IS AN APOLLO GRADUATE THIS YEAR ALSO AND WILL BE ABLE TO TEST AS AN EMT. HE WOULD ALSO LIKE TO HIRE MATTHEW CARNEY AS A FULL TIME FIGHT FIGHTER. HE HAS ALREADY PASSED HIS BACK GROUND CHECK. TRUSTEE KESSEN ASKED IF WE HAVE A REQUIREMENT THAT THE EMPLOYEES WORK A REQUIRED MINIMUM HOURS TO STAY ON THE ROSTER. CHIEF RADER EXPLAINED THAT WE ARE WORKING ON THAT IN THE HANDBOOK REVISIONS AND HE IS SENDING EMAILS AND PHONE CALLS TO THOSE NOT WORKING HOURS.

CHIEF RADER ALSO SPOKE ABOUT THE DEPUTY CHIEF POSITION. HE HAS CONDUCTED INTERVIEWS. JASON SMEDLEY IS READY TO STEP DOWN FROM THAT POSITION.

EMS WEEK IS MAY 18TH – 25TH. SO FAR THIS YEAR THEY HAVE HAD 398 PATIENT CONTACTS WHICH IS 3 PER DAY. LAST YEAR THEY HAD 1080 PATIENT CONTACTS. THIS YEAR THEY HAVE HAD 469 CALLS FOR SERVICE.

THEY RECEIVED AN AWARD FROM LIMA MEMORIAL.

MONDAY IS MEMORIAL DAY. PLEASE REMEMBER THOSE THAT SERVED.

THE MARCS RADIOS ARE UP TO DATE. MARCS PAGERS NEED UPDATED AND IS \$1,872 FOR THE BUILDING AND ABOUT \$4,000 FOR 5 PAGERS.

THE ALTERNATOR ON THE GENERATOR WENT BAD AND WAS REPLACED BECAUSE OF THE MAINTENANCE CONTRACT WE PAY FOR WHICH SAVED A LOT OF MONEY PLUS SAVED US FROM A POWER OUTAGE AT THE FIREHOUSE DURING THE LAST STORM ON MAY 16TH. THE FRIDAY NIGHT STORM CAUSED A LOT OF DAMAGE. THERE WAS A LOT OF POWER OUTAGES FROM RESIDENCES AND BUSINESS'. GREAT TEAM WORK FROM ALL FIRE EMPLOYEES HANDLING MULTIPLE CALLS BACK-TO-BACK WITH LIMITED STAFF AND RESOURCES. THEY WERE ALSO ON THE LIMA NEWS FOR A CALL RELATING TO A DOG.

HE ENROLLED IN A PROGRAM FOR SUPPLEMENTAL PAYMENT PROGRAM FROM MEDICAID. IT IS NOT GUARANTEED BUT MAY GET AN ADDITIONAL 5 – 10%.

TWO HOSE BEDS ARE BEING REPLACED. THE TOTAL IS LESS THAN \$500.

HE'S GETTING A TIRE QUOTE ON 1403 WHICH WILL FINISH UP THE TIRE REPLACEMENTS ON ALL VEHICLES.

THEY HAVE BEEN WORKING ON FIRST DUE INVENTORY LIST. HE THANKS ASHLYN TRACY FOR KEYING IN OVER 900 PIECES OF EQUIPMENT.

CHIEF RADER WILL BE ON VACATION FROM JUNE 11TH – 23RD.

GUESTS

CATHY AND FRANK CLEMENTZ – SHE STATED THAT SHE DOESN'T UNDERSTAND WHY ZONING MEETING MINUTES AREN'T BEING RELEASED. JOHN BREWSTER STATED THAT ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS MEMBERS WASN'T PRESENT TO APPROVE MEETING MINUTES. SHE ALSO ASKED WHY A DOG GROOMING BUSINESS COULDN'T BE THE SAME AS A FARRIER BUSINESS WHICH IS AGRICULTURAL. FRANK ALSO SPOKE ABOUT THE ZONING MINUTES BEING CHANGED ABOUT THE DATA CENTER AND HOW IT WAS DONE. THE BOARD AND CHRISTINA EXPLAINED THAT THE MOTION FROM THE PRINTED ZONING MEETING MINUTES WAS NOT CORRECT. SANDY AND CHRISTINA LISTENED TO THE RECORDING AND CONFIRMED WITH THE ZONING MEMBER MAKING THE MOTION AND THE MEMBER THAT 2ND THAT IT WAS WORDED WRONG AND WAS THEN CORRECTED AND THE MEMBERS APPROVED THE CORRECTION. FRANK THEN ASKED ABOUT THE TRUSTEES WORKSHOPS THAT DIDN'T HAVE MINUTES AND ABOUT THE SHED SIZES THAT NEEDS PERMITTED. JOHN BREWSTER STATED THAT THE 12 X 12 SHED'S ARE TAXED IN LIMA AND ALL SHEDS NEED PERMITTED IN LIMA. PERRY TOWNSHIP IS REQUIRING PERMITS ON SHEDS 10 X 10 OR LARGER BECAUSE THEY HAVE BEEN PLACED ON PROPERTY LINES AND IN UNSAFE AREAS AND THAT PEOPLE ARE LIVING IN THEM WHICH IS WHY THEY NEED TO HAVE A PERMIT NOW SO THAT THE TOWNSHIPS OFFICIALS CAN CONTROL WHERE THEY ARE BEING PLACED AND WHAT THEY ARE BEING USED FOR. JOHN EXPLAINED THAT WHEN PERMITS ARE TURNED INTO THE COUNTY THAT IS HOW THEY TAX THOSE SHEDS THAT ARE 12 X 12 OR LARGER. AT THE JUNE 11TH ZONING MEETING WE WILL BE SURE TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FROM JANUARY UNTIL NOW. FRANK SPOKE ABOUT CINDY LEIS WHEN WE WERE DISCUSSING THE PROPOSED DATA CENTER. AEP BILLS ARE SUPPOSED TO BE GOING UP FOR EVERYONE BECAUSE OF THE INDUSTRIAL PARK ON COLE ST IN LIMA AND MAY CAUSE POSSIBLE BROWN OUTS. TRUSTEE COX SPOKE TO SOMEONE FROM AEP AT THE TIME AND THEY SAID THAT POWER WASN'T AN ISSUE.

CHRISTINA DETER – SHE ASKED ABOUT OPENING A DOG GROOMING BUSINESS. JOHN BREWSTER WILL CHECK WITH REGIONAL PLANNING.

JASON STOMBAUGH – HE SUGGESTED WE ASK ABOUT TARIFF COST BEFORE ORDERING. DEPARTMENT HEADS ARE ALREADY LOOKING INTO IT.

JIM CLEMENTZ – JIM ASKED ABOUT THE DIGITAL SPEED CAMERAS. CHRISTINA STATED THAT THEY WERE ORDERED APRIL 30TH. JIM ASKED ABOUT THE OLD CRUISER. THE TRUSTEES THEN DISCUSSED IT.

TRUSTEES

GREG KESSEN – SPOKE TO REX HUFFMAN ABOUT MICROSOFT PULLING OUT OF OHIO. IT WAS BECAUSE OF POWER CONCERNS.

PERRY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH HAS BEEN IN THE PERRY TOWNSHIP SINCE THE 1960'S. A LOT OF METHODIST CHURCH'S HAVE SPLIT OFF INTO DIFFERENT SECTS. THEY HAVE CHANGED THEIR NAME TO PERRY CHURCH OF FAITH WHICH HAS A 10 AM SERVICE ON SUNDAYS. HE ENCOURAGES THAT IF THE COMMUNITY IS LOOKING FOR A PLACE OF WORSHIP TO PLEASE ATTEND. THE TOWNSHIP ALSO USES THE CHURCH FOR LIFEWISE.

GREG THEN SPOKE ABOUT THE BUDGET CONCERNS. WE MAY HAVE TO MAKE SOME CUTS BECAUSE IT IS GETTING TIGHTER. THE BUDGET MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 3RD.

CHRISTINA LET THE BOARD AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS KNOW THAT WE ORDERED 8 MORE 8 FOOT BANQUET TABLES FOR THE RENTAL HALL WHICH GIVES USE A TOTAL OF 16 NOW. JUST IN TIME FOR GRADUATION PARTIES.

KEVIN COX – KEVIN SPOKE ABOUT A GOLF SCRAMBLE HELD BY PERRY LOCAL SCHOOLS ON THE 26TH OF JULY AT COLONIAL GOLF CLUB FOR FOURSOMES. TEE TIME AT 8AM. OCCASIONALLY SOMEONE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT GOES OR A TRUSTEE FROM PERRY TOWNSHIP.

CHIEF RADER STATED THAT IN OTHER AREAS THEY HAVE HAD TO CALL HAZMAT FOR WELLS SO THEY ARE JUST TRYING TO KEEP THAT FROM HAPPENING. KEVIN SPOKE ABOUT YEARS AGO FRYE'S WAS GETTING OIL IN THEIR POND.
